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Greetings City Council members and City Clerk,

I agree with the AHNA that speeding motorists on Adams Street are endangering the residents of Adams Hill. However, I don't think that the best solution is a stop sign that can be ignored by speeders.

I would prefer a speed hump, similar to what we have on Palmer in front of the park. There are more speed humps on Verdugo a mile away on the other side of the hill (in LA). On Verdugo, the humps are staggered between north and southbound lanes so that emergency vehicles can go around them.

I know the fire department opposes speed humps due to the impact on their response times. However, this is a situation in which there are competing safety issues, and I would favor the preventative safety measure (speed hump) instead of the reactive safety measure (stop signs have shorter response times, but cause accidents themselves).

I think it should be the role of the City Council to resolve conflicts between departments and the public. We all know that speed humps are the most effective approach to controlling speeders. I ask that City Council tells the fire department that they lost this argument, and have a speed hump

installed.

Notice of City Council Meeting to Address the Proposed All Way Stop at Adams St. and Scofield Dr.

The Glendale City Council will be addressing the proposed all-way stop at Scofield Drive and Adams Street at their Nov 5th meeting this Tuesday.

The City of Glendale Public Works Department recommends the intersection at Scofield Drive and South Adams Street, as it meets all the criteria for their Traffic Calming Program.

The intersections at Yale Drive and Cornell Drive were also studied and do not meet the criteria at this time.

The installation of a all-way stop will discourage the massive amount of vehicles speeding up and down South Adams Street. The installation of crosswalks will also add much needed safety measures for pedestrians who use the adjacent Mini Park and businesses.

The City Council will be voting to pass one of three options:

- * Motion setting the matter for a public hearing
- * Motion ordering the Transportation and Parking Commission to rehear the matter
- * Motion dismissing the appeal forthwith

The Adams Hill Neighborhood Association is advocating the implementation of this Traffic Calming Measure on South Adams Street.

We would like to encourage our membership and neighborhood residents to make the Mayor and City Council aware of your support.
