Project Description

The City Council initiated the update of the Citywide Bicycle Transportation Plan (BTP) in February 2022, with a vision to shape the next two decades of safe, convenient, and inviting biking infrastructure in Glendale. Engaging the public through an interactive online map and significant outreach events, inputs from the technical team, Project Development Team (PDT), Sustainability Commission (SC), and Transportation and Parking Commission (TPC) resulted the development of a well-connected citywide preliminary bicycle network.

In this report, staff presents an update on the progress of the BTP development, and respectfully requests further input and comments from the Planning Commission and from the Sustainability Commission on the Bike Network Map and City's implementation phasing. The overarching goal for this project is to establish an all-ages, all-abilities bicycle network for the entirety of Glendale.

Environmental Determination

Exempt from further CEQA Review, as the Planning Commission and Sustainability Commission will be receiving an informational report and providing feedback, and will not be taking any action to approve or adopt the aforementioned items; accordingly, the commonsense exemption applies because this item does not have the potential for causing a significant effect on the environment, and it can be seen with certainty that there is no possibility that the activity in question

may have a significant effect on the environment CEQA Guidelines No. 15061 (b) (3).

DISCUSSION BY COMMISSIONERS

Planning and Sustainability Commissioners discussed the project and expressed the following concerns and made recommendations to the City Council for their consideration.

- Concerned about the lack of inclusivity for bicyclists with disabilities, elderly, and children.
- Cost Estimate for the construction, operations, and maintenance of the proposed project.
- Public outreach and involving public in discussions.
- Affect of “AI – Artificial Intelligence” and “self-driving” vehicles on this plan.
- Updating the City’s “Circulation Element”.
- Clarification on how bike activated traffic signals work and how they compare to pedestrian signals.
- Disagree with legalizing sidewalk riding in business districts.
- Motorized vehicles and e-mobility should be prohibited from using sidewalks.
- Lacking a safe place to ride in the street means, some people may ride on the sidewalk.
- Compromise should be made where sidewalk riding is allowable if there is no dedicated bike lane.
- All bicycles should have a license plate.
- Reducing speed limits and educating individuals of their rights and responsibilities of the road.
- Providing Bike parking in private and new buildings.
- Maintenance of bike lanes and reconfiguration.
- Co-ordinate with Police, Fire, and Public Works Departments.
- Map showing high and low volume streets.
- Upgrading some of the existing bike routes to “Bike Boulevards”.
- Bike facility on Honolulu Avenue should continue west under the freeway to connect directly to La Tuna Canyon Road.
- Include Glendale Avenue and Chevy Chase Drive in Phase I in coordination with the ‘CIP’.
- Determine geographic areas for the geographic equity map.
- Fault data in crash analysis.
- Regional or national standard for crash density and rates, and how does the City of Glendale compare.
- Is the crash methodology used, including the crash density, a national standard.
- Compared to the City of Los Angeles, City of Glendale has safer streets.

- Why in the crash analysis are they called Draft Safety Corridors.
