I would be honored to serve the City of Glendale. As a Commissioner I would bring creative problem solving and progressive ideas for City placemaking, but I also have substantial and relevant practical experience related to how governing functions, concepts are implemented, the relationship between various entities. I seek to collaborate and make connections between goals and functions that can otherwise be isolated but are better approached collectively—such as links between mobility and land use patterns and sustainable communities. I have worked with a variety of Commissions and I am committed to be professional, collaborative, transparent, and to truly add value to the process to improve outcomes.

PLANNING COMMISSION

I'm motivated to see additional public spaces in southern Glendale in particular, as well as overall increased transit access and mobility improved quality of the built environment—not just new development projects but shade, trees, and features to sidewalks and public rights of way. I like the way the City's vitality has increased with a broad range of destinations and activities related to arts and entertainment. We can continue to increase walkability, neighborhood access to amenities, and emphasize inclusive placemaking. I'm interested in innovations to support local businesses and housing our residents. I believe the "Greener Glendale" initiatives the city undertook about a decade ago could use a refresher. I'm interested in the long range strategy for Community Plans and Land Use, so there is a collective and contextual deliberation about the City's future. I sense there are a number of existing policies that are sensible but need specific implementation tools. In general, I'd like to showcase the people of Glendale and its special character as a place that is welcoming and distinct.

PARKING AND TRANSPORTATION COMMISSION

In thinking about Mobility and the Parking and Transportation Commission in particular, I do think that Commission could better serve with a more robust variety and scope of topics for review. They routinely review requests for speed bumps, initiated by the public and as part of the Traffic Calming Program, but the program emphasizes bumps in lieu of other alternative measure which can provide additional benefits, such as street trees, which have multiple positive impacts including the aesthetics and shade, and could be similar cost. I believe the Commission could be used more broadly to review access and mobility initiatives for the City. Another key endeavor is the North Hollywood/Pasadena BRT line, and I'm interested in what the MOU looks like between Metro and Glendale, curious about the value capture program looks like, and what our work is for Transit Oriented Planning along the line. And finally, it would be important to begin considerations on Aerial Mobility (drones and vehicles for passengers and delivery)—it's not very far out, and we'll want to be sure it's approached equitably and that the City has control over the outcomes.

If appointed to either of these commissions, similar to my "day job" goals-- My priorities are to promote equity and sustainability, through improvements and approaches that are developed through a meaningful and robust outreach processes, and which are practical and implementable. My understanding is there may not be an opening for Planning Commission.

I manage the Community Planning Bureau, which is responsible for policy and initiatives that are geographic-based, including the Community Plan Update Program to renew the City's 35 Community Plans and rollout the comprehensive new zoning code through each Plan Area. The Bureau also develops Transit Neighborhood Plans, Specific Plans, and other localized district overlays, and amendments to such for the entirety of the City. Approximately 80 staff comprise the Bureau. My priorities are to create plans that promote equity and sustainability, are developed through a meaningful and robust outreach processes, and which are practical and implementable. As part of the Executive Team, I report to the Director and contribute to department-wide decisions. I commonly represent the Department at City Council, City Planning Commission, and with other Agencies. As well, I am the Department's Chief Sustainability Officer (since 2014) and serve as a liaison to the Mayor's Office for that effort.

PRIOR EXPERIENCE IN LOS ANGELES DEPARTMENT OF CITY PLANNING

I was promoted within the Department sequentially since joining in 2001.

Principal City Planner, Central Project Planning and Valley Project Planning Divisions (May 2015- Dec 2018)

I was the division manager of Central Project Planning and during a portion of that time concurrently managed Valley Project Planning, both of which conduct case/project review in geographic teams. This meant overseeing 44 staff responsible for implementation by reviewing development proposals in 22 Community Plan Areas covering a 333 square mile area. I governed the structure of the two offices, set priorities and assignments, trained and mentored, and directly supervised six staff. I reviewed the written work of planners and was responsible for the quality, content, and timeliness of thousands of determinations and staff reports yearly. During my tenure, the Divisions underwent restructuring and each incorporated two formerly separate offices.

Senior City Planner, Metro Neighborhood Projects Section (Aug 2012-May 2015)

I supervised project review for a Section that comprised 21 Community Plan Areas including more than 58 overlay districts and specific plans, covering a 230 square mile geography. I represented the Director at hearings and to decisionmakers, and was lead for the West, Harbor, and East Area Planning Commissions as well as coordinating departmental meetings covering those geographies. Under my leadership, the Division became more cohesive, communication and expectations were clearer, and the work produced was held to a higher standard of accuracy, design excellence, and substantive quality. I instituted collaborative problem solving with other divisions and emphasized the value of project review responsibilities in the context of the Department mission.

City Planner, Community Planning West/Coastal, and Central (Jan 2009-Aug 2012)

As a Unit Lead, I supervised policy work and project review in a variety of communities. Project planning work included: Historic Preservation Overlay Zone Unit implementation of 30 historic districts, USC Specific Plan Adoption, Wilshire Grand Tower Project Planner (with Development Agreements), and overseeing the Venice Unit. Policy work included the creation of Community Design Overlays, (such as the award winning Lincoln Boulevard CDO Establishment) and creation and adoption of the first Citywide Design Guidelines.

City Planning Associate, Community Planning West/Coastal (Jul 2005-Jan 2009)

After this first promotion, my work consisted of a combination of policy and project planning, such as contributing to Westside Community Plans and as a staff planner reviewing Density Bonus Projects (mixed income affordable housing).

In my initial position, my work consisted of a combination of policy and project planning, including developing a Local Coastal Program for the Palisades, and implementing the Westwood Specific Plan.
