5. CITY COUNCIL/STAFF COMMENTS

Councilmember Asatryan announced that hundreds of civilians and soldiers have died, hundreds more are injured, 20 have been taken as prisoners of war and over 7,600 people have been displaced as a result of the unprovoked attacks by Azerbaijan on Armenia proper last week. She added that the Armenian National Committee of America Glendale Chapter has shared a letter with her, which the Mayor also supports and has forwarded to the City Manager. addressed to Speaker Nancy Pelosi in support of House Resolution 1351 which holds Azerbaijan accountable and asks for the full enforcement of the U.S. Freedom Support Act Section 907 that would ban all of U.S, aid to the Azerbaijani government. She inquired about the process of having a combined signature from all councilmembers and asked her colleagues if they would agree to jointly sign. Councilmember Najarian added that he would like letters to also be sent to the United Nations, the Council of Europe, and the European Union. All Councilmembers agreed to support and sign. Each Councilmember will sign individual letters and a combined packets of the letters will be sent from the City Management office to the parties.

Councilmember Brotman nominated Chris Lowery for GWP Commission.

Councilmember Devine commended the Parks and Open Space Foundation for the "Stars in the Park" fundraiser they held last Saturday at Deukmejian Wilderness Park. She also

invited the public to see a play entitled "Everybody," that has premiered in the Antaeus Theatre in Glendale.

Councilmember Najarian attended the annual airport conference in Minneapolis. He stated that a detailed report will be presented to council in a couple of weeks.

Mayor Kassakhian announced that September 20th is National Voter Registration Day and invited eligible individuals to register for the upcoming election in November. Mayor Kassakhian stated that Mayor Choi of Jung-gu of Busan, South Korea and Chairman Choi of Namsung Academy, a dual immersion school in Busan, South Korea came by to visit. Kassakhian indicated that the city is looking forward to strengthening the bonds between the two cities. Mayor Kassakhian thanked the Fire Department in Station 26 for the ceremony they held in commemoration of the 21st anniversary of 9/11. He attended the John Henry Weidner Foundation of Altruism event in honor of Carl Wilkens and Damas Gisimba. He also attended the Jewish World Watch event, and the Parks and Open Space Foundation fundraiser.
