

## Glendale Boards and Commissions Qualifications or Background

### With Subject Matter Expertise

- **Arts and Culture Commission -**

- A. "For two (2) members of the arts and culture commission, the following qualifications are desirable, but are not a requirement, for serving on the commission:
  - 1) One (1) commission member is an elected official, an employee, student, or volunteer of the Glendale Unified School District; and
  - 2) One (1) commission member is an elected official, employee, student, or volunteer of:
    - a) A community college, state university, the University of California education system, or a private institution which provides instruction at the college level or higher; or
    - b) A trade or vocational school.
- B. For three (3) members of the commission, the individuals must have substantial professional expertise as:
  - 1) An artist, designer, or arts administrator in the fields of the performing, visual folk or literary arts, or architecture; or
  - 2) A business community leader with an acknowledged record of stewardship of the arts.
- C. Except for a student of a school, each member must be a qualified elector of the city all the time of appointment and during incumbency."

- **Audit Committee** - "All members of the audit committee shall be public members who shall be persons with relevant experience serving as a corporate officer, auditor, attorney or professional consultant to business, government or organizations."
- **Building and Fire Board of Appeals** - "Each member shall be either active at the time of appointment or previously active in the building construction business. A minimum of two (2) members, one (1) of which shall be qualified to practice architecture or civil engineering in the state, shall also be qualified on matters pertaining to the Glendale building and safety code, pertaining to building regulations; and a minimum of one (1) member shall be qualified on matters pertaining to the Glendale building and safety code pertaining to fire regulations, or pertaining to the area of fire protection."
- **Design Review Board** - "At least one (1) member of each design review board group shall be a licensed architect. Other members of the board shall be persons who, as a result of their training, experience and attainments are qualified to analyze and interpret architectural and site planning information, including, but not limited to, licensed landscape architects, urban planners, engineers and builders/developers."
- **Historic Preservation Commission** - "All members shall demonstrate interest, competence and knowledge in historic preservation. Composition of the commission shall include at least one (1) member doing business in one or more of the disciplines of architecture, history, architectural history, planning, archaeology, or other historic preservation related fields."
- **Transportation and Parking Commission** - "At least three (3) members of the transportation and parking commission shall be persons who either currently or previously as a result of their training, experience and attainments are qualified to analyze and interpret transportation and parking information including, but not limited to, transportation planning, transportation program management, transportation and advisory agency, civil engineering, transportation, traffic engineering or urban planning."

Without Subject Matter Expertise

- **Civil Service Commission** - "...consisting of five (5) qualified electors of the City of Glendale."
- **Commission on the Status of Women** - "...shall be individuals who have exhibited leadership qualities in the community or other activities relating to the general welfare of women."
- **Community Development Block Grant Advisory Committee** - "No person shall serve on the committee if he or she has any decision-making authority in a community organization that applies for or receives funds through the community development block grant. Any participation by a committee member as a decision-maker in such community organization must have ceased at least thirty (30) days prior to the time of appointment and may not occur during incumbency. Alternatively, any community organization with a decision-maker that is also a member of the committee shall not be entitled to receive funds through the community development block grant as long as the member continues to serve in both capacities. For purposes of this section, any person serving on the governance board, e.g., board of directors, of a community organization shall be deemed to have decision-making authority in that organization."
- **Parks, Recreation & Community Services Commission** - "...shall be a qualified elector of the city at the time of appointment and during incumbency."
- **Planning Commission** - "... shall be a qualified elector of the city at the time of his or her appointment and during his or her incumbency."
- **Water and Power Commission** - "... shall be a qualified elector of the city at the time of his or her appointment and during his or her incumbency."
