RECOMMENDATION

Staff respectfully recommends that City Council approve a Resolution authorizing submittal of application for payment programs and related authorizations for CalRecycle Payment Programs and Related Authorizations for five years.

BACKGROUND/ANALYSIS

The California Department of Resources Recovery and Recycling, CalRecycle, provides grant payments to governmental agencies to support beverage container recycling within their jurisdiction. The goal of this program is to maximize the redemption of California Refund Value (CRV) beverage containers. Each jurisdiction's designated funding amount is based upon the City's population.

In recent years, the City of Glendale received \$50,025 for grant period 2018-19 and \$50,598 for grant period 2019-20. In the past, the City has used CalRecycle funds to purchase public use recycling containers that have been installed at Kenneth Village, Montrose Shopping Park, Civic Center and downtown Glendale. These State supplied recycling containers are a good reminder for the residents and visitors to recycle in Glendale. In order for the City to obtain future CalRecycle funding, a new resolution must be approved by City Council every five years.

New CalRecycle funds will be used for community outreach such as specialty school recycling education programs, multi-family recycling totes, community newsletters and internal recycling collection containers for commercial customers. Recycling program outreach has become more critical as the City continues to implement State mandates that require recycling at apartment buildings and business establishments.

FISCAL IMPACT

The City of Glendale receives grant funding annually from CalRecycle to promote recycling Citywide. This annual payment will be deposited into the refuse revenue account 32501-5300-PWD-0000-P0000-T0000-0000-0000.
