EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Since 1993, the Fire Department has established and managed the Used Oil Curbside Collection Program. This free service to Glendale residents picks up their used oil and oil filters on a monthly basis. The Fire Department annually collects from the curbside program and household hazardous waste programs over 8000 gallons of used oil and 3000 pounds of oil filters and sends them to be recycled. This OPP Grant provides funding that assist in the continuing safe disposal of used oil and oil filters.

COUNCIL PRIORITIES

Environmental Stewardship: Submitting this grant application will help to provide funding to prevent the improper disposal of used motor oil and protect the environment from oil contamination.

RECOMMENDATION

It is requested that the City Council approve the attached resolution to submit an application for grant funds for curbside collection of used oil and oil filters.

BACKGROUND

Since 1992, the Glendale Fire Department's Environmental Management Center (EMC) has been successful in securing this grant in order to provide curbside collection of used oil and oil filters from Glendale residents. The program collects and recycles more than 8,000 gallons of used motor oil annually.

The recommended action will authorize the Glendale Fire Department to submit an application to the California Department of Resources Recycling and Recovery (CalRecycle) for the 2022/2023 Used Oil Payment Program (OPP).

This grant is awarded to local government agencies for programs that provide used oil collection opportunities. The funding from this grant can partially offset the salary and benefits of the position assigned to the Used Oil Recycling Program, as well as other program-related costs (i.e., programming, materials, training).

The objective is to continue our effective curbside collection program that provides Glendale residents an environmentally appropriate disposal option for used motor oil. This program is in addition to our Wednesday and Saturday Household Hazardous Waste collection days at the EMC. The Thursday curbside collection program is available by appointment to Glendale residents only.

The principle goal of this program is to divert hazardous waste from being disposed of at the City's Scholl Canyon Landfill and to reduce incidents of illegal disposal, and injury to the public and the environment.
