Report: Renewal of Verizon Wireless Agreement

Resolution dispensing with competitive bidding and authorize the Deputy Director of Finance/Purchasing to execute a purchase order with Verizon Wireless for wireless data, voice, and accessories for a period of two (2) years for an amount not to exceed \$600,000.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The City of Glendale utilizes wireless LTE data and voice services to deliver several services to the community. Since 2012, the City of Glendale has used Verizon Wireless to provide these services. Over the years, Verizon has been the primary wireless service provider of voice and data coverage in Glendale and surrounding areas.

As the City's current agreement with Verizon expires on December 31, 2022, staff are requesting to dispense with competitive bidding and continue with Verizon Wireless for two (2) more years for an amount not to exceed \$600,000 through the State of Utah NASPO Master Agreement MA-152 and any agreement superseding it.

COUNCIL PRIORITIES

Executing a purchase order with Verizon Wireless for wireless data, voice, and accessories is consistent with the following Council Priority:

Mobility/Connectivity/Safety

RECOMMENDATION

It is respectfully recommended that City Council dispense with competitive bidding and authorize the Deputy Director of Finance-Purchasing to execute a purchase order with Verizon Wireless for wireless data, voice, and accessories for a period of two (2) years for an amount not to exceed \$600,000.

BACKGROUND

The City of Glendale utilizes wireless LTE data and voice services to deliver several services to the community. Since 2012, the City of Glendale has used Verizon Wireless to provide these services. There are several applications of wireless carrier-based data and voice services throughout the City including the following examples: enabling first responders to deliver emergency services via Fire and Police dispatch systems, mobile telephone voice and data services, mobile field inspections, parking enforcement and remote network access. Over the years, Verizon has been the primary wireless service provider of voice and data coverage in Glendale and surrounding areas.

Since the City began using Verizon in 2012, discounted pricing has been obtained through the NASPO ValuePoint Master Service Agreement. NASPO ValuePoint contracts use the power of cooperative purchasing through a lead-state agency (in this case Utah) to achieve more favorable pricing than could be obtained by an individual state or local government entity because of the collective volume of potential purchases by numerous state and local government entities. Use of the NASPO Master Agreement ensured that the City is getting the best price available for Verizon Wireless services.

ANALYSIS

In recent years wireless voice and data coverage has become very competitive. While Verizon historically has had the best nationwide coverage, the other two main players in the industry, most notably AT&T/FirstNet and T-Mobile, have made significant improvements to their respective networks. In May of 2021, the City made a request for quote of AT&T/FirstNet and T-Mobile to evaluate the cost of other LTE providers. It was determined that T-Mobile was the lowest cost service provider. Since then, the City has been actively moving LTE devices over to T-Mobile. However, not all LTE devices can be moved, due in part to specialized devices or other unique use cases. While the City's goal is to move most of the LTE devices to the T-Mobile contract, there will always be a place where multiple LTE carriers are necessary.

As the City's current agreement with Verizon expires on December 31, 2022, staff is requesting to dispense with competitive bidding and continue with Verizon Wireless for two (2) more years through the State of Utah NASPO Master Agreement MA-152 and any agreement superseding it.

ALTERNATIVES

Alternative 1: The City Council may approve the resolution dispensing with competitive bidding and authorize the Deputy Director of Finance/Purchasing to execute a purchase order with Verizon Wireless for wireless data, voice, and accessories for a period of two (2) years for an amount not to exceed \$600,000.
